Sustainable construction and circular economy leadership

The Australia Pavilion is built using a circular economy approach, reusing materials from major international events. Almost 80% of the main structure is repurposed from the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, and additional materials come from the 2022 Birmingham Commonwealth Games. After World Expo Osaka 2025, these materials will be used in future construction projects, minimising waste and reducing environmental impact.

The pavilion also incorporates

Durra Panel®, an Australian-made,
environmentally friendly building
material created from compressed
wheat straw. This agricultural byproduct would otherwise be burned,

but repurposing it reduces pollution, stores 8.5kgs of carbon, and is fully biodegradable at the end of its lifecycle.

To further enhance sustainability, furniture, air conditioners, kitchen equipment, and other fittings are rented where possible.

Sustainable visitor experience and operations

Sustainability is integrated into every aspect of the Australia Pavilion experience. For example, the pavilion's food and beverage cabin exclusively uses biodegradable packaging, and staff uniforms are made from 100 per cent recycled fabric.
